30 interactive college & career activities offered 54 attendees in virtual events 54 participants completed at least one challenge activity 5 challenge levels available (ECE-adult) 4 languages supported (Dari, English, Spanish, Swahili) 3 counties engaged (Bernalillo, Sandoval, Torrance) 24 schools represented in registrations 16 community organizations and businesses participated 3 corporate shared purpose rewards committed 232 individuals registered (including individuals participating in school and community groups) 31 participants completed the challenge!





One youth participant proposed a service project to support Whitfield Wildlife Conservation Area after the Big Hole fire.

My cause is planting more trees at Whitfield after the Big Hole fire last week. Whitfield will need a lot of help with environmental restoration.



We will plant trees to begin restoring the land. We will work with Whitfield to identify what kind of trees need to be planted and where. We can begin planting right away. Future visitors will be able to appreciate the trees as they grow. Habits will come back because many animals are currently displaced. I think Whitfield lost 80% of its trees.




